### Welcome to ECI

- ECI is a statewide program.
- ECI serves children birth up to 36 months with a disability or developmental delay.
- ECI provides services in the child's natural environment.
- ECI uses a coaching approach to build the capacity of parents and caregivers.



## Eligibility

- Qualifying medical diagnosis
- Deaf or hard of hearing/visual impairment
- Developmental delay





### The Value of ECI

- Encourages collaboration between caregivers and professionals.
- Facilitates coordination among community resources.
- Increases rate of growth in developmental areas.
- Reduces need for special education.




