The mission of Child Care Regulation is to protect children through regulation and education.

CCR Overview



On 9/1/2017, Child Care Licensing (CCL) transitioned from the Texas Department of Family & Protective Services (DFPS) to the Health & Human Services Commission. A new Regulatory Division was created within HHSC. Child Care Licensing became part of the Regulatory Division. In March 2020, CCL and was renamed Child Care Regulation (CCR).

On 9/1/2017, child care investigators were transitioned to DFPS as part of the Child Care Investigations unit. DFPS conducts abuse, neglect and exploitation investigations at child care operations.

CCR Overview



HHSC Child Care Regulation (CCR) has two major functional areas to carry out its regulatory role in child care:

- Daycare Licensing (DCCR)
 - Protects the health, safety, and well-being of children from birth through age 13 who attend daycare centers and daycare homes.
- Residential Child Care Licensing (RCCR)
 - Protects the health, safety, and well-being of children birth through age 17 who reside in residential childcare operations.

These two programs regulate 'out-of-home' care for children in Texas.

Major Program Functions




Major CCR program functions include:

- Processing applications and issuing permits
- Inspecting operations to ensure compliance with minimum standards, rules, and licensing laws
- Investigating violations of minimum standards, rules or licensing law (including unregulated operations)
- Providing technical assistance
- Taking enforcement action as necessary
- Developing minimum standards and administrative rules
- Educating parents and the public
- Conducting background checks



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




- Data Book Child Day Care Licensing (FY18, FY19)

 - Compare by age groups along with confirmed victims of serious injuries
 - Compare abuse/neglect to non-abuse/neglect
- Day Care Operation Monthly Status Changes (1/21; 2/21; 3/21)
 - Analyze weekly and monthly changes to operating status
 - Regional, County and State level data
 - Community efforts on building child care capacity
